# March of Dimes – New York State

In **New York**, more than **237,200 babies** are born every year, and the work of the March of Dimes touches each one of them, whether they are born healthy, prematurely, with a birth defect or other health complications.

Each year in New York:

- 20,531 babies are born preterm — that's 1 in 11 babies born too soon.
- 7,190 babies are born with a birth defect.
- 1,169 babies die before reaching their first birthday.
- Prematurity and birth defects are the leading causes of infant mortality.
- The medical and societal cost of preterm birth is \$1.1 billion.
